At the Bridge Table

Here are two problems to ponder over, a bidding problem and a declarer play problem.

Problem 1 (bidding)

Your partner (North) is dealer and opens 1 A

East overcalls 2 ♥ What is your bid?

Your hand (South) ♠ 63 ♥QJ94 ◆AK7 ♣T753

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Problem 2 (declarer play)

You (South) find yourself declarer in 3NT. The opening lead is Q♣. How would you plan to make 9 tricks? (This problem is for newer players only).

North - ♠ K 8

♥ AQJ3 ♦ Q72 ♣ 7642

South - ♠ A Q 5 3 ♥ 7 5 4

◆ KJT6 ♣ A K

Answers

Problem 1 (bidding)

This hand occurred in the semi-finals of the World Bridge Championships held recently in Poland, and was reported by Peter Hollands. Peter is a Melbourne based professional who presents regular YouTube videos on interesting bridge problems.

There is no single 'correct' answer to this problem, and our reason for featuring it is to make this point to newer players. There seem to be three possible bids – pass, double and 2NT. Arguments can be made for each of these. In the Poland match the player at one table chose to pass while at the other table the player doubled. We presented this problem to ten experienced players at BWBC and the choices were pass (3), 2NT (6), double (1).

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Problem 2 (declarer play)

This is an easy hand for experienced players. How did you go?

If you start by taking the heart finesse and it loses then, provided East returns a club, you will lose the race. However, playing on the diamond suit immediately, to establish 3 diamond winners, yields a certain 9 tricks $(3 \, \spadesuit, 1 \, \heartsuit, 3 \, \diamondsuit, 2 \, \clubsuit)$.

There are several important points here

- Make a plan at the outset, for the whole hand if possible, rather than thinking about one trick at a time.
- Look for safe ways to make the required number of tricks, and avoid finesses unless you absolutely need them or can take them safely.

If you have any questions about tricky hands you have encountered recently, or want to tell us about a hand you made using, say, a dummy reversal throw-in squeeze, let us know and we will feature them in a future newsletter.
