Dear Committee members,

I would ask the Committee to consider supporting the Wednesday/Monday groups by trialling upside down pairs/mentoring amongst themselves, Lorraine's suggestions eg 'PP' to get people to trial 'Open' while lessening their anxieties about confronting new stuff, and trial changing supervised criteria based on the following.

A breakdown of members by MPs:

500-1000 21;

300 - 500

14;

<300 135 (about 35 of these don't play in the Wednesday session)

100-300 36 (the highest MPs playing on Wednesday is 130)

<100 100;

30-100 36;

<30 64. (?How many playing?)
