## State Mixed Pairs/Country Mixed Pairs (17<sup>th</sup> - 18<sup>th</sup> May)



provide some insightful ways of making sure you get the maximum tricks available as a defender.

There are many books available in our club library. Check with club librarian, Karen Ody, who will be only too pleased to help find a book suitable for your level of bridge experience.



## At the Bridge Table - By Jaan

This hand was given in a recent Central Coast Leagues Club Bridge Club newsletter, and is reproduced here with permission. I thought it was interesting and instructive.



Imagine you are South, in a contract of 7 diamonds. How do you go about it? Looking at it from declarer's seat, it may not be obvious, even to experienced players. There are 4 apparent losers, 1 spade and 3 hearts. Suppose you exchange seats with partner, and now look at it from the North hand. Things look better! There are now 3 losers, 1 heart and 2 small clubs. The heart can go on a spade winner in the South hand, and the 2 small clubs can be ruffed in the South hand. Be careful with timing

and entries.

A play like this is known as a **dummy reversal** and the opportunity comes about reasonably often but, for some reason, is easy to miss.
